Attendance and Punctuality

As you know, regular attendance and good punctuality at school is vital to help children achieve and get the best possible start in life. Children who frequently miss school and are regularly late often fall behind.

There is a strong link between good school attendance, punctuality and achieving good results

We have noticed over the past year or so, an increasing amount of families requesting to take their children out of school for short breaks or holidays which can sometimes be as much as 2 weeks of missed school in one half term. We recognise that holidays out of term time are cheaper.

By Government definition, a child is deemed to be a persistent absentee if their attendance drops below 90%. Good attendance is seen to be 96% and above.

In order to support us with better attendance, and in turn benefit your child, we ask families to avoid taking day trips, long weekends and family holidays in term time. We also ask that any dentist or doctor's appointments are made outside of the school day, where possible.

If your child is genuinely unwell, then of course they must stay at home to get better, you are the parent and you know your child best as to when they are poorly. But if you are unsure, then send them into school and let the teacher know they are a little under the weather, as on lots of occasions, children rally once they are in the school environment and with friends. We would always contact you to collect your child if they were genuinely too unwell to be in school.

The government has launched its new campaign, 'Moments Matter, Attendance Counts' to improve attendance and punctuality in schools and we will continue to work with our Local Authority Attendance Officer to challenge and support families and ensure children are in school every day and in class on time.
