Maths	Understand that to subitise means to know an amount without counting.  Match the numeral with a group of items to show how many there are up to 5.  Use number names from zero to ten.  Recite numbers from 0 to 10 in order and back from 10-0 in order.  Counts objects from 0 – 10 in order and back using 1-1 correspondence.  Counts out 10 objects from a larger group.	Can partition with a wide range of objects up to 5. Be able to subitise (know amount without counting) to 5. Concretely adds one and subtracts one with numbers up to 10.
